 KS3 Feedback: Verbal feedback will be given within lessons through whole group or 1:1 comment, direction or praise. Through the use of the Showbie app, students and teachers are able to have specific dialogue about the assignment they are working on. If a student makes an amendment or an upload the teacher is notified and will aim to respond to every notification or message. The students are able to ask their teachers questions or for advice about work in specific assignments. A Feedback icon system is used which gives students and teachers a quick visual cue about their progress or achievements. Feedback icon key = An orange means the teacher thinks something needs checking or completing. A tick mark means the teacher thinks the work is amazing. A star is equivalent to a merit. A target is used to highlight a written comment to advise on how to make progress and improve. Students will be given time and opportunities to respond to this feedback after key pieces of work. Both written and practical assessments will take place once a half-term at the end of the topic. Pupils will be informed on how to improve on future assessments by using the feedback icon on Showbie, written comment on Showbie with a mark and possibly a verbal comment too.  Activities based on slides on Showbie assignments, will be self-assessed, some will be peer-assessed through a quick check, whole-class presentation of work on Showbie, this enables the teacher to view a snapshot of the work being completed. It encourages students to appreciate the work of others and inspire each other. This is to check literacy, numeracy, key terms, effort and presentation of work.

Homework:

- Homework will occasionally be set, where it is necessary for the benefit of the student for example revising for an end of unit test. The homework should take the pupils up to thirty minutes.
- When appropriate written feedback will be given on Showbie and merits awarded.
- Pupils will receive feedback from their homework within the half term after the deadline date.

verbal comment too. The AQA GCSE marking criteria grid relevant to the component will be shared and highlighted to show achievements and a mark awarded for the work.

- Practical assessments are uploaded to Showbie and each student can see their performance in relation to others but only see the feedback for themselves. For the students to be able to see the exact performance they are being marked on and reflect upon this with the teacher's feedback is valuable for future development.
- Written tests will be live through Google docs. This has proven useful for real- time feedback during remote learning so that students can be prompted and guided through exam practice questions. Real- time dialogue marking provides instant focussed written feedback from the teacher and through making instant amendments and additions the teacher can clearly see the thought-process of the student.
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Homework:

• In Year 10 and 11 homework will be set almost every week depending on the time of year and taking into account any extra rehearsals. The students should take between thirty minutes to an hour to complete this.

	 Homework will often be a written reflection task in the style of a exam question, or be a research task in preparation for creation in the lesson. Written feedback and the feedback icon on Showbie will be used for homework. Pupils will receive feedback from their homework within 2 weeks after the deadline date.
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
