Type and frequency of feedback and homework by Key Stage:

KS3& Year 10

Maths Department

Feedback:

- Verbal feedback will be given within lessons through whole class Q&A and while the teacher circulates the class checking understanding and looking for errors or misconceptions.
- Dialogue marking will take place after each unit of work –
 approximately twice per half term. Written comments will outline
 strengths and targets for improvement. This will appear as a purple
 feedback and next steps sheet stuck into exercise books.
- Students will be given time and opportunities to respond to this feedback after key pieces of work.
- Assessments will take place at the end of each unit of work. Pupils
 will be informed on how to improve through QLA feedback sheets
 with next steps to improve or extend understanding.
- Books will be checked at the end of each unit of work. This is to check literacy, numeracy, key terms, effort and presentation of work. This may be seen as teacher comments or stickers and reward stamps in books.

Homework:

- Homework will be set weekly and should take the pupils up to 30 minutes.
- Homework will be predominately set online although written homework may be used periodically if more appropriate.
- Online homework will be automatically marked and have instant feedback and where misunderstandings remain there will be the opportunity for pupils to ask for direct feedback from their teacher.

Feedback:

 Verbal feedback will be given within lessons through whole class Q&A and while the teacher circulates the class checking understanding and looking for errors or misconceptions.

Year 11

- Due to the nature of revision and exam preparation there will be a heavier emphasis on practise exam paper completion and marking in year 11.
- In all classes practise papers or partial papers will be completed and marked on a regular basis. These will be self-marked or marked by the teacher, and kept in a folder for revision purposes.
- Day to day teaching will be directed towards gaps identified in test paper marking or mock exam QLAs.
- Pupils books will be checked by the teacher while circulating the class and may be live marked to identify and correct errors or misconceptions but there is no expectation of regular teacher marking and feedback as this is done through the practise papers

Homework:

- Homework will be set weekly and should take the pupils up to 60 minutes.
- Homework will be predominately set online although written homework may be used when more appropriate – practise exam papers for example.
- Online homework will be automatically marked and have instant feedback and where misunderstandings remain there will be the opportunity for pupils to ask for direct feedback from their teacher.
